Travel Report

Following the invitation of the RV8-Enthusiast Group Germany, we have participated on their annual tour event with great pleasure.

Our journey started on **May 1st** from Lindau/Switzerland to Bad-Brückenau together with our dear colleagues Edith Nauer and Peter Meier (Le Mans green RV8/432), who accompanied us on the 1st stage to Böblingen.





We planned a stopover in Böblingen, near Stuttgart, where we stayed in the beautiful **V8-Hotel** with its very related Classic Cars & Airlines funny themed rooms. An unforgettable experience indeed!



On **May 2nd**, we continued our journey on our own to Bad-Brückenau, where we were warmly welcomed at the **Bad Hotel** by the organizers and participants of the RV8 Tour 2025. We were offered a welcome drink in the beautiful hotel garden, followed by a very nice dinner à la carte.







Before meeting with the whole group, we had the opportunity to visit the nearby and very interesting bicycle museum, which is located in the center of the village of Bad-Brückenau. Afterwards, we took a long walk through the beautiful, historic park and the flower gardens around the hotel with the thermal complex in bright sun and pleasantly warm temperatures.



On **May 3rd**, after an excellent breakfast, the traditional photoshooting moment with our friends and their 14 beautiful RV8's, a very nice MGB in rare and original aqua blue paint and a destinguished perlescent dark blue Maserati Coupé GT couldn't be missed.







In a convoy, the tour began over national roads and scenic areas to Fladungen for a visit and a short hike in the famous BLACK MOOR.







After a short drive to Tann, we took a lunch break at the "Rhön Dorf Erlebniskaufhaus" and a visit to the local handicraft production of the Rhöner Bonbon-Factory.







After another short drive to the RADOM Wasserkuppe in Gersfeld, 950 m above sea level, a very interesting guided tour of the European Air Radar and Surveillance Center, which was built and used by the occupation and defense forces of the American army after the **WWII** followed.

This visit will be remembered in its significance and forever.











Arrived back at the hotel in Bad-Brückenau, a very nice dinner buffet followed after the obligatory photos of the MGs and their crews.



The two organizers of the Tour Claudia and Christian Mai were then honored with kind words and a small gift of recognition and appreciation.
